What are you doing this Monday? The Bishops of the three downstate Dioceses of New York, Brooklyn, and Rockville Centre hope you will spend part of it seeking God's healing and forgiveness in the sacrament of reconciliation.

Reconciliation Monday comes a month and a day after Archbishop Dolan issued a pastoral letter on the sacrament of reconciliation entitled *The Altar and the Confessional*. Copies of the letter are at the church doors for you to take home and read.

The celebration of the sacrament of reconciliation is a regular feature of the ministerial life of Saint Jean's, and many laity, religious, and priests avail themselves of it, both in the church and in the Parish House. It is a joy to know and to experience the depths of God's mercy.

By the seventeenth century, the Catholic Church had emerged as a powerful and wealthy patron of the arts. Painters and sculptors in Catholic countries such as Italy and France were the most productive interpreters of the passion of Christ, whereas those in Protestant Holland preferred secular subjects such as landscapes and still life. Although based primarily upon accounts in the four Gospels, representations of the passion relied upon contemporary treatises and traditions. This presentation, in the heart of Holy Week, will explore the artists' choices, struggles, and solutions for depicting the passion.

BOOK BY FATHER CAMIRÉ

The Parish Office has copies of Father Bernard Camiré's *The Eucharist and Saint Peter Julian Eymard*, a compilation of ten reflections given two years ago in Liverpool, England, in preparation for the feast of Saint Peter Julian on August 2. This is a wonderful resource for learning more about the life and theological insights of the Apostle of the Eucharist, whose bicentenary of birth is this year. The cost is \$5. SPECIAL LECTURE

On Monday, April 18, at 7:00 p.m., Saint Joseph Church (Yorkville) will host a lecture commemorating the third anniversary of the historic visit of Pope Benedict XVI to the church. Dr. Anton Koekemoer, a research astrophysicist at the Space Telescope Science Institute in Baltimore and a participant in many of the projects carried out with the Hubble Space Telescope, will speak on "Faith and Science in Harmony: The Heavens Declare the Glory of God." The event is free and will be followed by a reception. The lecture will take place in the school auditorium, 420 East 87th Street.

GOOD FRIDAY STATIONS
OVER THE BROOKLYN BRIDGE

On Good Friday, April 22, Communion and Liberation will sponsor the Way of the Cross over the Brooklyn Bridge. Participants will congregate for the first station at Saint James Cathedral, Brooklyn, at 10:00 a.m. The procession will move to the bridge for the second station and then across into Manhattan for stations at City Hall Park, Ground Zero, and Saint Peter's Church, concluding at 1:30. At each station, there will be a reading from the passion narrative, a meditation, reflection time, and hymns.

FAST AND ABSTINENCE

The Lenten fast has a long history in the church, dating back to the first centuries of Christianity. Its purpose is to simplify our lives so that we can recognize our reliance on God and be renewed in spirit.

Good Friday is a day of fast and abstinence. This means that Catholics age 18 until 59 are allowed one full meal. Two smaller meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken. Catholics 14 years of age and older are to abstain from meat.

If health or other considerations prevent you from fulfilling these, you are encouraged to find other expressions of self-denial.

Our Annual Easter Brunch is on Sunday, May 1, after the 10:30 and 12:00 Masses. A delicious brunch will be served in the Community Center. Everyone is welcome to celebrate the joy and new life of the season. The Easter Egg Hunt for the children will follow the 10:30 Family Mass. Come, see the "running of the little ones"!

Next Advent, certain changes will be made to the English texts of the Roman Missal, containing the prayers for the celebration of the Mass. In preparation for this, we offer a year-long series on the Eucharist, our central act of worship as Catholics.

The Liturgies of Holy Week

Holy Week is the culmination of the liturgical year. During these holy days, the liturgy will lead us, with Jesus, to the depths and to the heights. It begins with a harsh juxtaposition, as we carry palms in remembrance of Christ's triumphant entry into Jerusalem and then listen to the passion according to Matthew, as the King is handed over for crucifixion.

Then, on Holy Thursday, we remember the night Jesus was handed over — [when] he gave himself for us and to us, to live in our midst forever in the sacrament of his body and blood. On Good Friday, we touch with our hands the mystery of the Lord's cross, the instrument of torture that has become the tree of life. Then, at the great Easter Vigil, the lighting of the paschal candle speaks to us of the triumph of light over darkness, of life over death. The resurrection of the Lord becomes a living reality in our midst as the catechumens for whom the church has prayed throughout Lent are plunged into the mystery of Christ's death and share in the glory of his resurrection. These are indeed holy days, the culmination of the church's liturgy, and an invitation to participate in the very life of Christ. Let us worship!

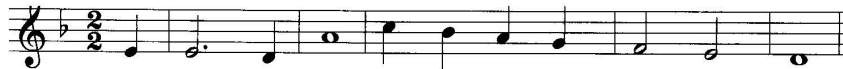
